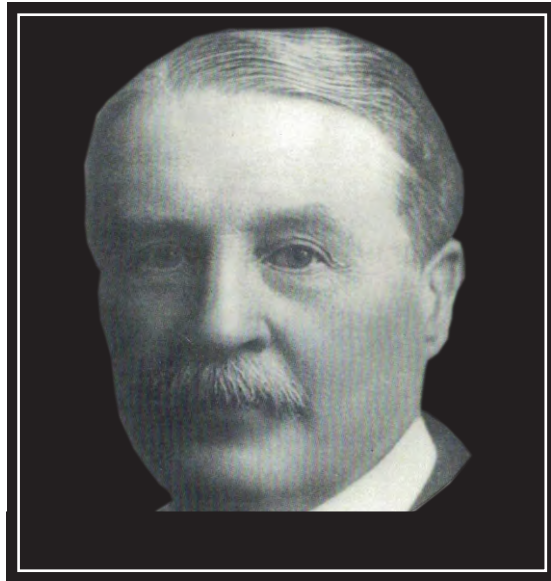

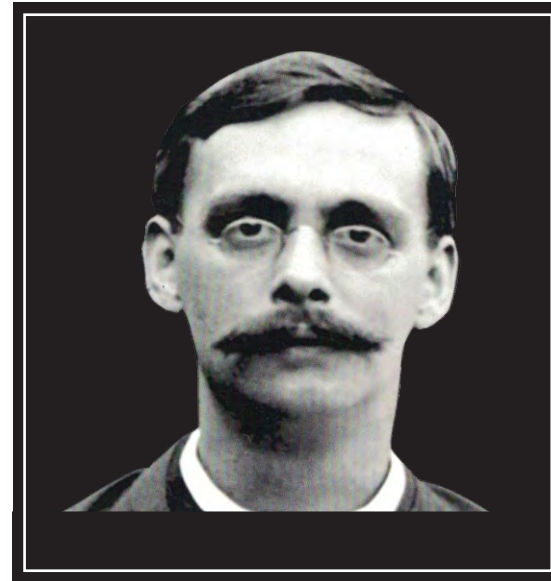

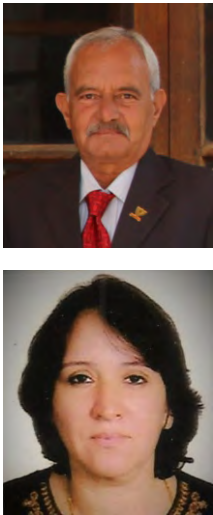
### Vision

## Location

The Laidlaw Memorial School and Junior College stands in a forested area in the heart of the most beautiful valley in South India, at an elevation of 2082 metres (6,864 feet) and its campus covers over 224 acres, thus providing ample space for play fields and sports grounds, in idyllic surroundings. Ketti is half way between the hill stations of Ootacamund (11km) and Coonoor (13km). Ketti Railway Station is in the Salem Division of the Southern Railway.







## School Curriculum

The Laidlaw Memorial School and Junior College is a private, minority unaided Co-educational Institution, administered by St. George's Homes Society, and affiliated to the Council for the Indian School Certificate Examinations, New Delhi.

The Medium of instruction is English.

The General Course of Studies includes:

English in all its branches; Integrated Mathematics, Hindi, Tamil, Indian and World History, Civics, Geography, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Bio-Technology, Economics, Accountancy, Commerce, Environmental Science, Home Science, Psychology, Art, Crafts, General Knowledge, Handwork, General Science, Commercial Application, Economic Application, Commercial Studies, Moral Instruction, Physical Education and Computer Studies. The classes are conducted by trained and qualified teachers. These general subjects are offered on enrollment of a minimum of 5 students.

## Guidance Cell

All children deserve a happy childhood and the opportunity to lead a life of dignity; safe from violence, exploitation, abuse, neglect, deprivation and discrimination. The Guidance Cell of the Laidlaw Memorial School and Junior College aims to give a protected childhood through Child Rights and Protection Centre (CRAPC) formed under the guidance of State Council of Educational Research and Training.

The Guidance Cell conducts various awareness programs and seminars on topics like Cyber Safety, Child Rights Protection, Suicide Prevention, Child Marriage etc. A Safety Box to receive complaints and feedback is placed near the Head Master's Office. Awareness Posters are also displayed to create awareness among the children.

## Counselling Cell

The Laidlaw Memorial School and Junior College is in a position to provide students with necessary guidelines and tools that would help them realise their full potential and prepare them mentally for global competition. The primary motive behind counselling at school level is to address the emotional, social and behavioural needs of the students. Counselling creates a seamless and friendly environment to help each other with different approaches like Individual counselling, group guidance, regular assessments, relationship building, conflict management and many more. The counsellor is a remedial teacher, a special educator, an invigilator and an advocate, adding to their therapeutic and assessment duties. The counsellor examines the student's potential skills in building self esteem for success. The counsellor is the bridge between students, administration, teachers and parents. The counsellor identifies and addresses issues that interfere with education. Career guidance and life skills development help in further success. The counsellor helps to deal with depression, anxiety, stress and much more.

## Catering Department

The Laidlaw Memorial School and Junior College has a well-equipped kitchen with skilled staff that maintains strict hygienic standards to offer quality and healthy food for Vegetarian and Non-Vegetarian students. The school provides well-balanced tasty meals, with a wide variety in the menu, suitable for all the students from different parts of the country.

A Mess Committee has been formed by the Principal which includes students, teachers and matrons. Meetings are conducted every month to decide on the menu.

We are also equipped with a bakery where we prepare our own bakery items.







## Sports and Games

Games are an important and integral part of School activities and are compulsory for all students. Overall physical development is essential for mental development of the students, this would, in turn enable them to come up with innovations and creations. The Laidlaw Memorial School and Junior College is dedicated towards providing sports amenities for overall growth of the students. 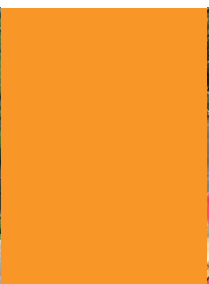
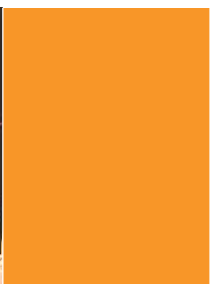
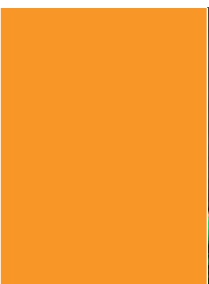
### The Games and Sports include:

## Internationalism

The International School Award (ISA) now called International Dimension in Schools (IDS) in India, was introduced in the year 2003 and nearly 2500 schools across the country have joined this exciting journey since then. The range of schools participating in the programme varies from well-resourced private schools to government schools from rural areas and schools for the less advantaged communities. The International School Award now has a presence in 31 countries worldwide. International Dimension in Schools celebrates a school embeds effort to include international work as part of their curriculum and helps embed it within the school embeds culture. The programme supports schools in fostering an international ethos throughout the school and embedding it within the curriculum. Laidlaw had won the ISA Award for the year 2019-2022.

At present the IDS in India is undergoing a review and will presently start in the near future.

- b. **IIMUN:** An IIMUN is an academic simulation of United Nations where students act as diplomats and discuss various international affairs and try to come up with solutions solve them. We not only simulate UN but also Indian Parliament, in order to make our youth aware about issues in our nation. The solutions are then sent to our government and the UN to let them know about the students' opinions on the current international, national or local topics discussed by them.

### c. Operation Smile

The Operation Smile is a non-profit organisation that was started in 1982 by Dr. William P. Magee Jr. and his wife Kathleen S. Magee. Its headquarters are in Virginia Beach, Virginia. This organisation is committed to providing cleft lip and palate repair surgeries to children worldwide. Laidlaw School has contributed to this organisation by helping young leaders build awareness, raise funds, educate others about OS mission through events. Children learn to empathize and give their best to bring lovely smiles on the faces of these unfortunate children. The Parent Faculty and School can give these children a chance to grow up without life-threatening health problems, social stigma, isolation and feelings of hopelessness.

- d. **IAYP:** The Laidlaw Memorial School and Junior College is working with the International Award for Young People (IAYP) which delivers the Duke of Edinburgh's International Award in India to offer our school new ways to broaden its curriculum. The organisation believed that learning should not be confined to the classroom, but should also take place in the school environment and the wider community. Currently students from over 240 institutions across India participate in the Award Programme. So far over 100,000 young people have successfully gained their Awards. The IAYP is a non - Governmental Organisation (NGO) and is a full member of the Duke Edinburgh's International Award Association.

It creates opportunities for young people to develop skills, get physically active, give service to their local community and experience adventure.

The program is non-competitive and anyone with perseverance and enterprise, including differently abled, can enrol for the Award. In this, young people choose an array of activities that are appropriate to their environment and best suited to their own personal interest

For adults, the program provides an opportunity to help and mentor youth by sharing their individual skills and experiences.

**LEVELS OF AWARD:** The Award offers three levels. An aspirant can enroll in any one of the three levels of the Award after meeting the age criterion as mentioned below.

**Bronze Medal:** Minimum age 14 years. Minimum time commitment: 6 months

**Silver Medal:** Minimum age 15 years. Minimum time commitment: 12 months. For Bronze Award holders: 6 months

**Gold Medal:** Minimum age 16 years. Minimum time commitment: 18 months. For Silver Award holders: 12 months

- e. **INTERACT CLUB:** Interact is a Rotary-sponsored service club for young people. The Interact Club of our school comprises of students from standard VIII to XII. Under the guidance of the Rotary Club of the Nilgiris, Coonoor, the members of our school's Interact Club participate in meaningful service projects. Planning, organizing and conducting service activities through the Interact club helps students develop leadership skills while discovering the power of 'Service Above Self'.





## Residential Accommodation

The 'Cottage System' is followed in the school, where several large cottages accommodate the children in residence. There are twelve such Cottages, housing children of various age groups.

Cottages for Boys: (1) Hesketh, (2) Hammick I, (3) Hammick II, (4) Oldham, (5) Ash, (6) Oakshott, and (7) Lewis.

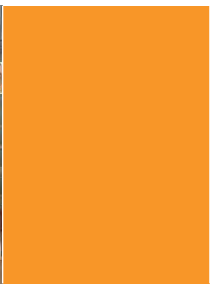
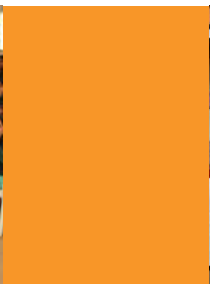
Cottages for Girls: (8) Blackburn, (9) Preston, (10) Lancashire I and (11) Lancashire II And (12). Smith Cottage caters approximately to 60 boys and girls under the charge and supervision of a Resident House Warden and Matrons. It is a self-contained building for children of STDs. I, II and III, and has in addition to the dormitories, classrooms, dining room, play rooms and play grounds.

All facilities are provided in the dormitories according to the age of the students and the requirements of privacy.

Since majority of staff reside on campus, either in the cottage or its adjacent staff quarters, individual care and treatment of every child is ensured.







## Admissions

Children are admitted from Class I onwards, and applications for Admission have to be made in the form prescribed. The minimum age for admission is 5 plus years, and the child must have attended a Kindergarten for at least two years. Children are admitted after an evaluation which is conducted in December. Admission policies are subject to change from time to time.

Application forms are also available online which will be valid only after registration.

At the time of admission, parents or guardians must produce the following documents:

- Transfer Certificate from the previous school attended.
- Document showing the date of birth. (Only Transfer Certificate is accepted. Birth Certificate will be accepted if the child is admitted in class 1). Original and a copy must be produced on admission.
- Medical Certificate of fitness and the absence of any infectious disease.
- Copy of Aadhar card.
- EMIS number (as applicable).

### Fees

All new admissions will have to pay a Caution Deposit, Admission Fee and School Fee for the full year at the time of admission immediately after the personal interaction. The Caution Deposit is refundable on the child having completed one full academic year when the child leaves School and all his / her dues have been settled. However, if admission is granted to a child, accepted by the parents, the requisite fees paid and subsequently, the parents should suddenly decide they do not want to send their child / children to School, then a three months' notice charge will be recovered from the fees already paid and the balance refunded.

- The School Fee is payable in two installments for the viz., 1st installment due in April & 2nd installment due in September. However, students of Std X, XI & XII have to pay the whole year's fee at the beginning of the Financial/Academic year viz April
- No reduction in fees is permissible if a child is temporarily absent for part of a term.
- At the time of Public Examination (Class IX, X, XI & XII), Special Examination Fee, as specified by the body controlling and conducting the Examination, has to be paid.
- Fees for the Theory and Practical Music Exams will also have to be paid.
- Payment of Fees is acceptable online only.

**REFUND OF CAUTION DEPOSIT:** The Caution Deposit is refundable when the child leaves School and all his

/ her dues have been settled and the same will be transferred online to the Bank Account of the Parents soon after the final audit is over. If the refund is not accepted within a 5-year period after leaving school, it will be written off as 'NOT PAYABLE'.

### NOTICE OF WITHDRAWAL

If a parent intends to withdraw a child, three months' notice must be given. In lieu of notice, three months fees (covering both boarding and tuition) will have to be paid before the relevant T.C. is issued. Where a child is not coming back to School for the next academic year, the parent concerned must give the school, a notice by January 1st of the current year (in the case of outgoing student of Std X). The notice must be conveyed to the Principal in writing. In the case of students of Std XI, if a child after paying the fees for the year decides to withdraw, a 3 months' notice charge will be levied / recovered from the fees and balance refunded.

### EXAMINATIONS

Candidates are prepared for the following Examinations:

- The Indian Certificate of Secondary Education at STD X.  
(This is an All-India Examination).
- The Plus 2 Course of Indian School Certificate Examination at STD 12.  
(This is also an All-India Examination).
- The Examinations in the Theory and Practice of Music in Piano, Vocals, Drums, Violin and Guitar of the Associated Board of the Royal School of Music, London and Trinity College, London.

Candidates preparing for these Examinations, or learning Music otherwise, may be given special lessons at prevalent fees.

Duplicate Reports will be sent on request, on payment of Rs.250/-.

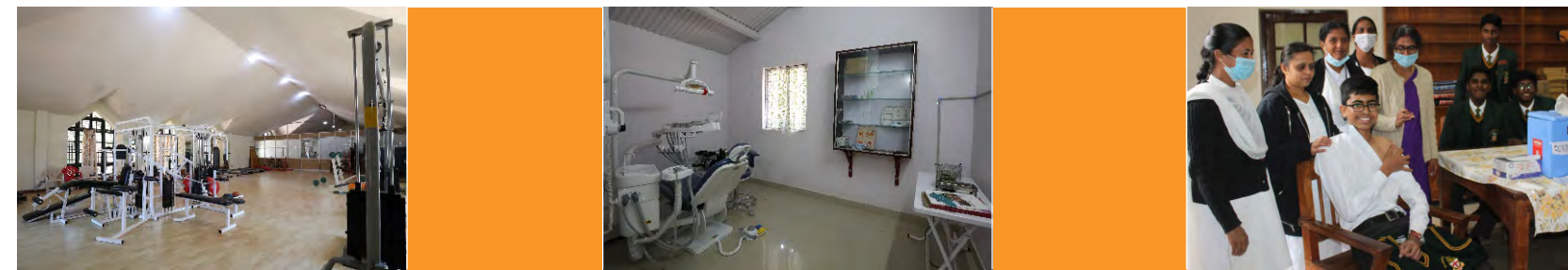






## Library

The Laidlaw Memorial School and Junior College Library is in existence since the establishment of the school. The Library has variety of books which cater to the needs of the students and staff of all age groups. Prominent national dailies and magazines are also subscribed in the library. The library provides books of interest to promote and cultivate reading habits among students. The library is up-dated and the users are also provided with e-library services.



### CHAPEL

The Laidlaw Memorial School and Junior College Chapel, set in idyllic surroundings, is surely one of the most beautiful Chapels in the Nilgiris. It was built in the year 1914. Priests, Pastors and laymen conduct morning and evening services on Saturdays, Sundays and on special occasions.

Children have the privilege of receiving the Sacrament of Holy Communion and Confirmation by the Catholic and Protestant churches with the consent of the parents. The day begins with the morning service in the Chapel.

### HEALTH/CLINIC

The Laidlaw Memorial School and Junior College has a well-equipped clinic, dental clinic and a dispensary. There is a fully qualified Nurse in charge of the Clinic, and the treatment of patients is prescribed by a daily visiting Doctor and visiting Dentist. All cases of serious illness are transferred to the private hospitals in Ootacamund or Coonoor. In case of serious illness or where the school Doctor advises, the parents are contacted by telephone or e-mail, (e.g. if a child needs special dental or eye treatment or has to be given spectacles). All pupils are given a thorough medical examination on admission and thereafter have periodical medical checks at which time their weight and height are recorded. Where a child has been under treatment prior to admission in the school, medicines sent by the parents will be administered, subject to the approval of the school Doctor. A prescription must accompany all medicines sent by parents. No child is permitted to keep medicines and if any, brought by the parents or the children must be handed over to the Nurse in charge of the Clinic.

### CLOTHES

The list of boarding requirements is given at the time of admission

### VALUABLES

Expensive articles such as cell phones, jewellery, costly pens, video games, expensive watches, etc., are not permitted.

### OFFICIAL CORRESPONDENCE

Correspondence or any other communication is to be sent by mail to [principal@laidlawschool.org](mailto:principal@laidlawschool.org) or [contact@laidlawschool.org](mailto:contact@laidlawschool.org). Letters must be addressed to the Principal and not to him by name. This is necessary to avoid delay, in case the Principal is out of station.

Please note that parents are not permitted to send letters to Teachers, Wardens or Matrons or any other Staff regarding school matters. It is important that parents notify the Principal of any change of address.

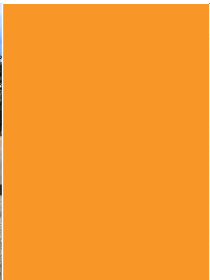
### HOLIDAY ARRANGEMENTS

**APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION**

**LOCAL GUARDIANS**

Children are allowed to visit or stay with official local guardians provided that the parents concerned have indicated the name/s of the local guardian in the Application Form for admission. Children are not permitted to stay outside the school over weekends, or be taken out by parents or guardians, except, where indicated in the School Calendar.

**VISITING DAYS/HOURS**

Visiting days and hours will be indicated in the school Calendar and should be strictly adhered to.

In the interest of the children and of their studies, parents are requested not to visit on days not indicated in the school Calendar.

**EXEATS**

No Boarder can leave the school campus without permission. If children do not return on time as mentioned in the exeat/calendar after the long vacation or after short exeats, they will be fined Rs.1000/- per day. Exeats as per the Calendar are issued by the Cottage Wardens or Matrons. Special exeats, giving children permission to leave the campus on days not indicated in the school Calendar, will be issued by the Principal only.

The school will not entertain requests from Parents to send their children to their friends' houses for the short holidays.

**APPOINTMENTS**

Appointments with the Principal can be arranged between 9:00am and 11:00am, 3:00pm and 4:30pm. Parents are advised to make an appointment in advance to meet the Principal on working days.

**DISCIPLINE**

Corporal punishment will not be administered under any circumstances.

Where a child is guilty of gross insubordination or indiscipline or repeated acts of indiscipline or

misbehaviour, the parents concerned will be informed. Children who appear to be intractable or who, in spite of warning and punishment, commit repeated acts of indiscipline, will be expelled.

**CINEMA**

The Laidlaw Memorial School and Junior College is equipped with Internet connection as well as TV, DVD, Overhead Projectors and LCD Projectors. Educational and Recreational films in English are screened on Saturdays.
